The Counselor-in-Training (CIT) program is open to students in rising grades 9-12 who have an interest in and enthusiasm for working with children in an outdoor setting and gaining experience in environmental education. CITs are part of the camp staff and volunteer under the supervision of the Camp Director and Garden Educators to assist with weeklong nature camps for children (PreK – 5th grade). Duties include engaging and overseeing children during camp activities (hands-on outdoor explorations, games, crafts, puppets shows, etc.), set-up/clean-up, and assisting with afternoon extended care (full-day camps). Service-learning hours granted.

Time Commitment: Minimum of 2 weeks (3 weeks preferred); 20-40 hours per week

Qualifications:

- Must be high school student in rising grades 9-12
- Enthusiasm for and experience working with children ages 4-10
- Self-motivated, responsible, flexible, team player, positive attitude (sense of humor a plus!)
- Interest in science and nature
- Willingness to work outdoors in summer
- Must be able to attend mandatory camp training: Thursday, May 28; 4:30 7:30 p.m.
