

Rules for Working at Carolina Community Garden (CCG) during COVID-19 Pandemic

(CCG is an outreach program of the North Carolina Botanical Garden (NCBG))

While we have taken these and other enhanced health and safety measures, an inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present.

- Before arriving for the workday, volunteers need to check for symptoms using the [Campus Health COVID Screening Test](#)
- UNC faculty, staff and student volunteers should be in compliance with all [Carolina Together Testing rules and procedures](#)
- Community volunteers should consult the [North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services COVID website](#) for the most up-to-date recommendations on how to stay safe.
- Anyone experiencing symptoms should not come to the workday.
- Upon arrival, volunteers need to wash their hands using the hands-free wash station or use the hand sanitizer provided by the CCG.
- Work gloves will be provided by the CCG. Work gloves used during the workday will be placed in a specified bag and will be washed before returning to circulation
- Anyone involved in harvesting should wear disposable gloves, provided by the CCG.
- Volunteers should bring their own water
