

# Carolina Community Garden COVID-19 Safety Guidelines



The [Carolina Community Garden](#) (CCG) is an outreach program of the North Carolina Botanical Garden, part of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. While we have taken these and other enhanced health and safety measures, an inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present.

## Safety Measures at the CCG

- Before arriving for the workday, volunteers should check themselves for symptoms of COVID-19. Read more on the [CDC website](#).
- Anyone experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 should not come to the workday.
- Upon arrival, volunteers must wash their hands using the hands-free wash station or use hand sanitizer provided by the CCG.
- Anyone involved in harvesting should either wear disposable gloves provided by the CCG or wash their hands for 20 seconds at the hands-free hand wash station beside the CCG.
- Work gloves will be provided by the CCG. Work gloves used during the workday will be placed in a specified bag and washed before returning to circulation.
- Volunteers should bring their own water.
